## C. R. Bard Foundation Matching Gift Guidelines

## **Objectives:**

C. R. Bard, Inc. recognizes its responsibility as a corporate citizen to assist non-profit organizations which improve the quality of life for our local communities. Through the Matching Gift Program, BARD seeks to complement gifts made by active employees and directors of C. R. Bard, Inc. and to financially support those organizations which are most important to them.

#### **Eligibility:**

To be eligible, an individual must be a member of the Board of Directors or an active U. S. employee of C. R. Bard, Inc. or any of its domestic operating divisions or subsidiaries at the time of the contribution.

#### Gifts:

For employees, BARD will match a gift of \$25 or more up to a total of \$15,000 per employee per calendar year. For directors, BARD will match a gift of \$25 or more up to a total of \$5,000 per director per calendar year. The contribution must be from the personal assets of an eligible contributor. The contribution can be in the form of cash, check, credit card, money order, or in securities. A gift of securities should be reported at the closing price on the date of donation. An eligible gift is one received by an organization, not one that is pledged. Matching grants are made on an unrestricted basis even though the donor may have designated how he wants the personal gift used.

BARD will also match pooled *employee* gifts, which must be submitted by one employee to the organization. This will be treated as the personal gift of that donor. If you have a question regarding eligibility or procedure, please contact the Matching Gift Coordinator.

### **Eligible Organizations:**

Non-profit organizations eligible for matching gifts must be recognized as tax exempt by the United States Internal Revenue Service under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code and must be open to, or operated for the benefit of, the general public. Organizations in the following categories qualify under the Bard Matching Gift Program:

#### Community Development:

• Non-profit organizations that work toward improving the local community such as boys and girls clubs, animal shelters, food banks, homeless shelters, American Red Cross, domestic violence programs, Special Olympics, youth camps and centers, international relief services, volunteer fire departments, etc.

#### **Culture and Arts:**

- · Public educational radio and television stations
- Non-profit programs organized to enrich the cultural life in the community including museums, community theaters, arts centers, libraries, historical societies, symphony orchestras, dance and opera companies

#### **Education:**

- · Accredited college, university, graduate school or college-level professional or technical school
- Accredited, non-public primary and secondary schools as well as public education foundations
- Independent College Funds of America and United Negro College Fund
- Private, non-profit schools for the mentally or physically challenged

#### **Environment:**

• Non-profit organizations involved in environmental quality and protection including land conservation, forest services, wildlife preservation, etc.

## Health:

- · Non-profit, voluntary hospitals accredited by the Joint Commission on Accreditation of Hospitals
- Non-profit single disease agencies and medical research centers including American Cancer Society, American Heart Association, volunteer first aid squads, hospices, mental health organizations, alcohol, drug and substance abuse organizations, health support services, etc.

## **Ineligible Gifts:**

The Matching Gift Program will not match donations to the following organization types: fraternal, social or veterans groups; professional or academic societies; alumni associations; religious organizations; political or lobbying groups and organizations that are primarily funded by federal, state or city government. Funds collected from *non-employees* in the form of sponsorships for walkathons and other fundraising activities are not eligible for a company match. Also ineligible are payments of the following: tuition, dues, subscriptions, tickets or fees; gifts of real estate or other property; premium payments for insurance; bequests, deferred giving plans or trust fund donations.

Eligible organizations receive one-to-one matching gift support from the C. R. Bard Foundation.

- Employees/Directors: Fill out Part A and send this entire form with your contribution to the non-profit organization. Please complete a separate form for each donation.
- Recipient Institutions: Complete Part B and return Part A and B to the address shown below.

## Administration:

C. R. Bard Foundation is pleased to encourage charitable giving through our Matching Gift Program. However, BARD does reserve the right not to match gifts to any organization that it determines is not an appropriate recipient for charitable funds. The Matching Gift Program may be revised, suspended, or terminated at any time at the option of the Corporate Contributions Committee whose interpretation of the program shall be final.
