Community Gift Matching Program

The Harris Foundation Community Gift Matching Program was established to encourage good citizenship on the part of Harris employees through support of charitable, cultural and civic programs that benefit their local communities. All organizations must be non-profit 501(c)(3) institutions eligible to receive tax-deductible contributions or international charities with equivalent certification.

Eligible Organizations

- Local charitable, cultural and civic organizations that have Harris employee support which have been approved by the Harris Foundation's Board of Trustees.
- Organizations must have a non-profit tax exempt classification under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Service Code, or equivalent international non-profit classification.
- Organizations must comply with all the applicable requirements of the Patriot Act and the Voluntary Anti-Terrorist Guidelines.
- Organizations (a) must not denigrate or advocate discrimination or violence based upon race, color, religion, age, national origin, ancestry, ethnicity, gender, gender identity, gender expression, sexual orientation, marital status, veteran status, military status, disability, genetic information, citizenship status, or membership in any other group protected by federal, state or local law or (b) have practices which, in the good faith determination of Harris Foundation, are otherwise inconsistent with company goals and policies.

Gift matching will not be considered for gifts designated for the following purposes:

- Individuals
- Athletic groups, scholarships, clubs and teams
- Faith-based organizations for religious purposes
- Professional associations, labor organizations, fraternal organizations or social clubs; social events sponsored by social clubs; gifts to booster clubs, sororities or fraternities
- Event sponsorships and advertising
- Political activities.

How the Program Works

- The Harris Foundation will match gifts paid (not pledged) to approved organizations between \$25 and \$1,000 per individual, per fiscal year (July 1 to June 30).
- Gifts will be matched until an organization reaches its approved aggregate limit of \$10,000 per fiscal year.
- Gifts must be made from the employee's own funds directly to approved organizations.
- Gifts may not result in a direct benefit or service to the donor or the donor's family (e.g.` tickets to athletic, social or cultural events).
- Gifts may be paid by cash, check, credit card or negotiable securities that have a publicly listed market value. The value of securities will be determined based upon the closing market price on the date of the gift.
- The Harris Foundation reserves the right to modify or discontinue the program at any time. The Harris Foundation determines the eligibility of organizations and gifts and its decisions are final.
- Gifts must be used for charitable, scientific or educational purposes.
- The Harris Foundation will not consider match requests for contributions that are more than six months old.
